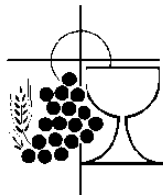

Pastor's Message

Dear Parish Family,

I'd like to thank Andres, Robert and Maria for planting those beautiful "Fall Perennial Flowers" in and around the signage in front of our Church. What a beautiful color they bring to our church doorstep. Speaking of flowers, I'd like also to thank the Walter's Flowers family for donating those two gorgeous floral arrangements on the sides of our Tabernacle. Thank you all for your generosity.

As mentioned in last weekend's announcement, on May 6th we will have a crowning of the Blessed Mother's Statue outside (along Prospect Street) immediately after the 12:15 p.m. Mass. The May Crowning is spearheaded by the Rosarians. For this event, I ask all the children in our Religious Education program and parishioners to join us.

May 6th we will also have our First Filipino Mass. It is scheduled at 5:00 p.m. and a light reception follows in the Parish Hall. Everyone is welcome to attend.

The parish staff has been planning for my installation as pastor on June 3, 2018 at the 12:15 p.m. Mass. For this momentous event, I ask you all to join me in this celebration. This installation is not just my celebration but our parish's celebration, so please mark your calendars. Let us all come and celebrate together as a parish.

We are now on the Fifth Sunday of Easter. The readings for this Sunday are powerful reminders that Christ is the vine and we are the branches. Growth occurs when we remain in him and bear fruit. This is clearly spelled out in today's gospel as it uses the imagery of a vine and branches to describe the relationship Jesus shares with the disciples, who need only "remain" in Jesus to assure an abundance of fruit. The Greek verb "mene", which is translated as "remain" or "dwell", has significant theological importance in the Gospel. Jesus' ministry and even the incarnation can be summarized as his remaining with us. On the other hand, the Johannine community understood that remaining in Jesus characterized an intimate, enduring, reciprocal relationship between Jesus and the Spirit, Jesus and the disciples, and Jesus and the Father. The word "remain" fills today's readings: remain on the vine, in Jesus, and allow His words to remain in us. But for Jesus' words to remain in us, we need to make time to read, listen to, and reflect on them. Let them "prune" away whatever does not reflect Jesus' way. St. Francis de Sales taught that it's not enough to carry the Lord on our tongue, speaking God's praise, or in our hearts, sharing our love and affection for God. We must carry the Lord in

our arms by good works. Without those good works, the other ways of carrying the Lord do not amount to much. Remain in Christ today and stay with him. Show that His words remain in you. Carry Him in your arms by your good works.

This week, the annual Catholic Home Missions appeal takes place. This grant-making agency of the USCCB provides resources that empower missionary activities, including critical help and pastoral services to mission parishes. It also provides financial support for training seminarians and lay ministers who serve ethnic groups in Latin America, Africa, Asia, and Oceania dioceses. If you can help in some way, we would be most grateful. Your donation will benefit these various ministries.

Newman's beatification was officially proclaimed by Pope Benedict XVI on 19 September 2010.
