2018 Lenten Regulations



The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday (February 14) and Good Friday (March 30). If possible, the Fast on Good

Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night as the "Paschal Fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully, and to celebrate more readily, His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence. On a day of Fast, only one full meal is permitted, and two smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast. On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of Abstinence.

The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.

The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent (February 18) to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity (May 27).

*Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.

Message from the Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

First and foremost I want to express my deepest gratitude and excitement for the opportunity to join you at the Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish here in Nutley as our new Pastor. As I began my ministry here effective February 1st, I have been overwhelmed by the warm welcome and hospitality of those I have had the opportunity to meet, especially our parish staff and a number of parishioners. As I look forward to begin my ministry here I am extremely encouraged by the unconditional love I already have felt and observed taking place within our parish community.

While I look forward to meeting you all, I want to share with you a little about myself. I was born and raised in the Philippines. I am the youngest of eight children (5 boys and 3 girls). My parents are now deceased. I was ordained a priest on November 8, 1986. I have been a priest of 32 years, 10 of which I served in the Philippines. During my priesthood, I have served in various assignments as Associate Pastor, Pastor, Diocesan Chancellor, Diocesan Financial Administrator, Youth Director, Rector of the Seminary, among others. Then I was sent to Rome to take advanced studies in Theology. I graduated with a Bachelor of Arts major in Philosophy and Sociology, a Bachelor in Sacred Theology and a Licentiate in Sacred Theology with high honors, at the Angelicum University in Rome. When I came to the US, I served as adjunct priest at Holy Family Church in Nutley for ten years, as Parochial Vicar at St. Stephen's Church in Kearny for 5 years and as Pastor of St. Andrew Church in Westwood, New Jersey for four years and seven months. On Thursday, February 1st, the Cardinal has appointed me as the new Pastor of Our Lady of Mount Carmel here in Nutley-this wonderful parish. I am really delighted and excited to be assigned here. I look forward to serving you in the weeks, months, and hopefully, many years to come.

As I have begun to prepare for my ministry here, I have nothing but excitement for what the future may hold for all of us. I'm excited to have the opportunity to serve this wonderful parish. My goal for my ministry here is to open up opportunities, serve our people with dedication and love, and make this parish a vibrant and welcoming parish (as expressed in our parish mission statement). One of my interests is to minister to the young and to the emerging generations so that they experience a God that is a love and timeless in ways that are meaningful and relevant to their lives. My prayer for this church is that these generations will be embraced and the ministry to them will be supported.
