

**Pastor's Message**

*Dear Parish Family,*

This Sunday is Pentecost Sunday. The Greek word for Pentecost (pentekoste) means "fiftieth," and in early Christianity it referred to the entire fifty days of Easter. Its roots can be found in the Jewish Festival of Weeks (Shavuot), the fifty-day celebration following Passover (Ex. 23:16). It was a harvest festival in which the first fruits of the harvest were offered to God in gratitude. It eventually became associated with the giving of the Torah on Mount Sinai. From early Christianity, Pentecost marks the descent of the Holy Spirit on the apostles. For that reason, it is often called the "the birthday of the Church". So as we celebrate today the birthday of the Church, I think it is fitting to wish everyone a "Happy Birthday!"

I'd like to congratulate Nicholas Molinaro and Marlene Palmer as the new Parish Trustees of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. As parish trustees, they serve on the civil governing body of the parish corporation. They assist the pastor in his oversight of parish management, which includes providing active, independent and informed review of all major decisions about the funds and property of the parish. Their term is one year, but there is no limit on the number of terms one individual may serve. As parish trustees, they will serve as ex-officio members of the Finance Council. For accepting this great responsibility, I thank them for their stewardship and service.

I'm asking the help of all our parishioners to campaign for children for our Religious Education Program. This weekend Sr. Mary Rose will be at the back of the Church before and after each mass to accept in person registration. If you know a family who has children and are looking for somewhere to enroll their children for Catholic education this coming year, invite them to enroll them here at Our Lady of Mount Carmel. This year we are offering a new program where we would like to involve both parents and children in the whole faith formation process.

As indicated in our bulletin announcements the past two weekends, during Memorial Day Weekend (May 26 and 27), we will again remember all our veterans especially those who gave their lives for our country. We would like to honor them in a very special way at all the masses that weekend so we are now accepting names of those you wish to be remembered.

I would like to thank you all for your continued stewardship. We appreciate your sacrifices and financial support to our parish. It is through your

**Pentecost**



The Christian holiday of Pentecost, which is celebrated on the 50th day after the weekly Sabbath during the Feast of Unleavened Bread (Leviticus 23:15), commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon

the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks, as described in the Acts of the Apostles. Some Christians believe this event represents the birth of the Catholic Church.

In Eastern Christianity, Pentecost can also refer to the entire fifty days of Passover through Pentecost inclusive; hence the book containing the liturgical texts for Paschaltide is called the "Pentecostarion". Since its date depends on the date of the weekly Sabbath during the Feast of Unleavened Bread, Pentecost is a moveable feast.

The term Pentecost comes from the Greek Πεντηκοστή (Pentēkostē) meaning "fiftieth" (50th). It refers to the festival celebrated on the fiftieth day after Passover,

also known as the "Feast of Weeks" and the "Feast of 50 days" in rabbinic tradition.

In Christian tradition, Pentecost is an important event that marks the shifting of God's redemptive purpose from the "descendants of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob" to all peoples. Scholars believe that even if the Pentecost narrative is not literally true, it does signify an important event in the history of the early Church that enabled the rapid spread of Christianity. Within a few decades important congregations had been established in all major cities of the Roman Empire.

The biblical narrative of Pentecost is given in the second chapter of the Book of Acts. Peter's sermon in Acts 2:14-36 stresses the resurrection and exaltation. In his sermon, Peter quotes Joel 2:28-32 and Psalm 16 to indicate that first Pentecost marks the start of the Messianic Age. About one hundred and twenty followers of Christ (Acts 1:15) were present, including the Twelve Apostles (Matthias was Judas' replacement) (Acts 1:13, 26), Jesus' mother Mary, other female disciples and his brothers (Acts 1:14).

According to scripture, while those on whom the Spirit had descended were speaking in many languages, the Apostle Peter stood up with the eleven and proclaimed to the crowd that this event was the fulfillment of the prophecy. In Acts 2:17, it reads: "And in the last days," God says, "I will pour out my spirit upon every sort of flesh, and your sons and your daughters will prophesy and your young men will see visions and your old men will dream dreams." He also mentions (2:15) that it was the third hour of the day (about 9:00 am). Acts 2:41 then reports: "Then they that gladly received his word were baptized: and the same day there were added unto them about three thousand souls."

Peter stated that this event was the beginning of a continual outpouring that would be available to all believers from that point on, Jews and Gentiles alike.

The main sign of Pentecost in the West is the color red. It symbolizes joy and the fire of the Holy Spirit. Priests or ministers, and choirs wear red vestments in celebration. Red banners are often hung from walls or ceilings to symbolize the blowing of the "mighty wind" and the free movement of the Spirit.

Red flowers at the altar/preaching area, and red flowering plants such as geraniums around the church are also typical decorations for Pentecost masses/services. These symbolize the renewal of life, the coming of the warmth of summer, and the growth of the church at and from the first Pentecost.
