## Pastor's Message

*Dear Parish Family,*

Today we celebrate World Mission Sunday. It is a day set aside for the Catholic Church throughout the world to publicly renew its commitment to the missionary movement. It was created by Pope Pius XI in 1926 as a day of prayer for the missions. In a personal way, the missionaries are dear to my heart. As a seminarian, I was formed and trained by the German missionaries from the Society of the Divine Word. As a priest, I worked and served alongside them in the mission areas. Some of them still serve in my native country, the Philippines. The Divine Word missionaries live among the poorest of the poor and serve in the far-flung areas. I have great admiration for them. We need to pray for them and all other religious and lay missionaries who have left home and are serving in foreign lands trying to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ through their preaching and selfless service. Aside from our prayers, they also need our financial support and assistance. Any money collected for the Mission Sunday Appeal will go to this fund. I thank those who made a financial offering for this worthy cause.

I would like to continue my discussion on the topic of popular devotions. This week, I would like to discuss some of the principles for the correct practice of popular devotions. Vatican II in its Constitution on the Liturgy outlines these principles: (1) The liturgy by its very nature is far superior to any of the popular devotions. Popular devotions have to be considered subordinate to the liturgy; they must fit into the picture and spirit of the liturgy and not the other way around. (2) They should harmonize with the liturgical seasons. (3) They should be in accord with the sacred liturgy. (4) They should be in some way derived from the liturgy and lead the people to it.

Let me deal specifically regarding saints. The Constitution on the Liturgy gives us some guidelines. In regard to Marian devotions, the Dogmatic Constitution on the Church will have to be taken into account. (1) The saints must be seen as marvelous works of the grace of God and fruits of the Paschal Mystery. (2) As such, they must always be transparent and point to the power of grace. They are signposts to God. If they were to obscure God or even to take His place, veneration would turn into idolatry. (3) They are great examples for us in their surrender to God and in their cooperation with the inspirations of God. If they were able to do it, why not us? (4) The saints are our brothers and sisters in the Body of Christ. There is a close union with them and we can trust in their intercession on our behalf. (5) Veneration of saints and special devotion to them is legitimate and good as long as they are given their proper place and do not take central position. Next week, I will explain the dangers inherent in popular devotions and some of the pastoral tasks.

This coming Saturday, October 27 at 11:00 a.m., we will have a parish healing mass. I invite those who are ill, the elderly and infirm, those who are weak from the burden of years, those who are preparing to undergo surgeries and those recovering to come and join us. We will administer the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for everyone who will come for this mass. May God continue to bless us and our loved ones.
