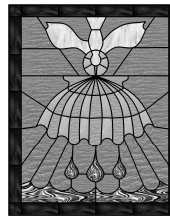

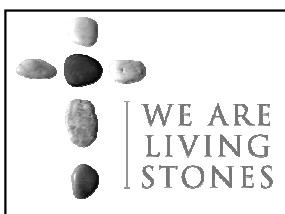
### Parish Membership...Why is it Important?

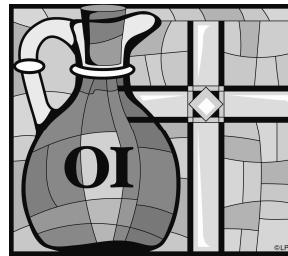

### **The Sacrament of the Sick**

(once called Extreme Unction), is one of two Sacraments of healing (the other being the Sacrament of Reconciliation) is a great gift to all of us. The

Sacrament of the Sick is one of the repeatable Sacraments the Church gives us and we find its roots in the public ministry of Jesus. As we know Jesus healed the sick, the blind and the lame as he walked among us. Jesus still offers us his healing through this extra-ordinary Sacrament. If we read, in the Bible, from the letter of St. James, we hear these words: "are there sick among you? Let them send for the priests of the Church, and let the priests pray over them anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick persons, and the Lord will raise them up. If they have committed any sins, their sins will be forgiven them." The Sacrament of the Sick as we have it today is for strength and healing of the body, mind and soul and should be celebrated in times of sickness, or when there is a chronic ailment. Unlike *Extreme Unction* one ought not wait until a person is dying to ask for the Sacrament, as it brings God's grace for healing. This Sacrament once also called "last rites" gives us the idea that when the priest comes to the house to anoint, the person receiving it is on death's door. Since Vatican II we have rediscovered the great gift of the Lord's love and mercy given to us in this great Sacrament.

Join us on **Saturday, October 15 at 11 a.m.** as we celebrate this Sacrament of healing. We also wish to invite any Health Care worker to come to the Mass for a blessing, as you are co-workers in the healing ministry of Jesus.

### Flapjack Fundraiser and Tricky Tray

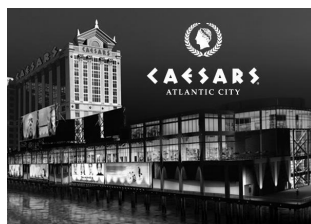
